

Comparative Adjectives – Full Lesson

Section 1: Forming Comparative Adjectives

Rule	Examples
One-syllable adjectives: add -er	tall → taller small → smaller fast → faster
Adjectives ending in -y: change y → i + -er	happy → happier easy → easier busy → busier
Long adjectives (2+ syllables): use 'more'	beautiful → more beautiful expensive → more expensive interesting → more interesting

Section 2: Irregular Comparative Adjectives

Adjective	Comparative
good	better
bad	worse
far	farther / further
little	less
many/much	more
