THE USE OF THE IMPERATIVE AND LET'S

The imperative is the same as the base form of a verb (the infinitive without "to"). The subject is not expressed but a "you" (plural or singular) is understood. Come here. Open the window. Turn on the light. To form the negative of an imperative, we use "do not", "don't" or "never". Do not shout! Don't cross the road.

Never drive when you

are drunk.

The imperative is used to tell somebody to do something. It is used in the following cases:

-To give an order:

Stand up when the president comes into the room.

-To give advice:

Go to the doctor if you feel ill.

-To give a warning: Don't swim in the river! It's

very dirty.

-To give instructions:

Press button A and B to set the clock on time.

-To make a request:

Help me carry this box, please. Pass me the salt, will you?
