Present perfect tense

Affirmative Form:

Subject + have/has + past participle.

Example : Jane has just started her third semester at the university.

Negative form:

Subject + have/has + not + past participle.

Example: Kevin has not planned to work in that factory.

Interrogative form:

Have/Has + **subject** + **past participle?**

Example : Have you ever been to Nova Scotia?
