

	Used for questions about intention	• Used instead to make requests and invitations	• More <i>Polite</i> for <i>questions about intention</i>		
*It is not used to express personal plans and predictions	• Used for predictions it implies that there are signs that the prediction WILL happen in the immediate future (i.e. there is more certainty)	• Used also for <i>predictions</i> but with <i>no</i> or <i>less certainty</i> i.e. there are <i>no</i> signs or evidence that the prediction will happen
