Capitalization means using a capital letter (for example, A instead of a). The use of capital letters helps readers read your writing without confusion.

Always capitalize the following:

#### The first word in a sentence.

- <u>I</u> grew up in India.
- She left a message on my phone.

# The pronoun I.

• This country is where <u>I</u> dreamed of.

#### The first letter of a proper noun (specific name).

- <u>D</u>avid wants to play soccer with us.
- This letter is from <u>Chang</u>.
- I graduated from the <u>University of New York.</u>
- I like <u>C</u>oca-<u>C</u>ola.
- She likes Godiva chocolates.

## The first letter of months, days, and holidays (but not seasons).

- Today is <u>June</u> 8, 2011.
- Susie's birthday is this Thursday.
- The shops are closed on <u>Easter</u>.
- This summer is going to be very hot.

#### The first letter of nationalities, religions, races of people, and languages.

- We often eat Italian food.
- I want to master many languages, such as <u>Spanish</u>, <u>Korean</u>, <u>Chinese</u>, and <u>Russian</u>.
- There is one Christian church in my town.

## The first letter in a person's title.

- This is Dr. Simon.
- I got it from Mr. Tom.
